#### **EVENTS**

**Dining with Elizabeth Update** 

Our shire's next event, Dining with Elizabeth, is June 28th.

Website: The website still needs to be updated but I did get an event created on Facebook. Kathryn will send Andrew information for the website.

Site Preparation: Diana and I (Kathryn), are autocrating this event, and we need a lot of help. We've talked to various people individually over the last few months but now we need to firm things up.

We would like to put up enough canvas to house tables for 80 people under roof - sides not required.HELP IS WANTED FOR THIS. That would be 10 tables in a U shape of 4 across and 3 on each side. The site does not have 10 eight foot tables so if anyone else has either 8" folding tables, or the makings of trestle tables (8 foot boards and saw horses) please let me know. The configuration suggested means at least 32 ft along the bottom of the U and 28ft along each side

We will also need help taking down all the canvas, which I will try to arrange to be done on Sunday afternoon when there is light.

We will also need Decorating help, kitchen help, and cleanup help. This is not event that can be done by just a few people Set up will likely start Friday, and take the place of dance on that day.

Canvas Donations: People that have considered donating canvas. Having many tents can help create visual interest, as the site is at a big space.

- -Alison Choyce a beautiful pavilion whose dimensions I do not know
- -I have a memory of a few other people saying at one of the meetings that we voted on the event that they had canvas also but no notes have appeared with names or dimensions.

Proposed schedule and activities:

Diana asked about other ideas for activities. Gambling was mentioned.

#### Artisans Challenge: Closing out the Event

The event went well. 49 people attended. The event made 37.57. The event was up against another A&S event to the North. More demonstrations of A&S are need for the event next time.

Posting pictures from this event and past challenges might help inspire others to accept challenges.

An idea was presented for us to try to raise money to help service the stove at the event site (the fire alarm went off during the event). Kathryn will inquire as to how much this cleaning/servicing would cost.

## Artisans Village (and Challenge): First Bid

Naomi will be taking over the job of autocrating Artisans Challenge, but she wants to combine it with an Artisans Village (similar to Artisans Row at Pennsic)

It will be a weekend long event in June of 2015. She is checking dates with the seneschals list.

The site is in Bhakail. It is Willow Grove Day camp, a sister site to the Tall Pines camp that Iron Bog uses for River Wars. The Willow Grove site talked with Tall Pines, and will give us the same site deal IB has. Naomi will be visiting the site on Tuesday.

The plan is to have different areas for different A&S activities. It will be set up like a village Areas will be scheduled at specific times to be on and presenting actively, or teaching classes during their on time. The times of different areas will not conflict with each other, however artisans demoing at the event can choose to simply play all day. However, this structure also gives them a chance to learn other things also; they are not stuck at a table all day.

#### Shire Wars: First Bid

Lady Mary of Montvale came to present the bid proposal for Shire Wars 4.

Some highlights from the bid:

- -The site is 45 minutes further away, but 3 miles off the TP.
- -The site has been renovated recently, with buildings and bathrooms added, and handicap accessibility improved.
- -Date Oct 10-12, a weekend long camping event

- -Est 100 people, with 80 for feast. However, the site bid is flexible, especially with regard to purchasing extra cabin space if the event becomes an RP.
- -The event needs at least 3 shires to sign on to be financially feasible
- -The event is Anglo-Saxon themed
- -There are many staff positions that still need to be filled
- Competitions should be announced no later than JUne 15th to give people time to prepare.
- -Event fees were listed, but the bid proposers will increase the figures a little bit to add more of a cushion. They will also create a separate youth (13-17) site fee.

Concern was raised about the readiness of staff to accommodate an RP. Lady Mary assured the group that the head cook at least would be quite able to handle a larger event, and that she has several people helping her to cook all the food for the weekend.

Looking ahead, they are thinking about the 2016 Shire Wars. They are looking at a more central event location and a theme to match the anniversary of the battle of Hastings (norman theme)

It was suggested that while Hartshorn-dale is putting up the money for the event, that any proceeds go directly to Archer's Forde. Their members help out a lot with that event.

The first bid was accepted, and Mary will send a second bid next month with updated figures and an event announcement
