Officers Reports

Seneschal: *Kathryn Perry:*

Note: the July meeting will take place on the second Thursday (not the first Thursday as usual). There will be no meeting in August by tradition.

Exchequer: *Diana Alene Tregirtse*Current balance of \$5,905.57

An IRS Audit of the SCA has resulted in corporate changes in Exchequer policy going into effect July 1, 2015. Some of the changes are as follows:

- -Autocrats must be prepared to turn over all financial information on events to the exchequer within two days of the event.
- -NMS payments need to be mailed within 10 days of the event.
- -Monthly reporting will begin in July with signed reconciled bank statements needing to be sent to the kingdom exchequer and kingdom seneschal.
- -SCA members cannot write a check to themselves if they are one of the two officers that needs to sign the check. Groups will likely need three local and accessible people to be signatories on the bank account. We have Diana, Kathryn, Michel, and Naomi. When elections are held in December, we should make every effort to change over signatories promptly.

Artisan's village

The event has:

- -Paid pre-reg: 28 adults, 3 kids, 25 for feast, and 14 for camping
- -24 people are currently on the unpaid feast list. Naomi believes we will be close to the 80 cap for feast.
- -41 people said they are attending on facebook (there is some overlap here with paid pre-reg)

Shire Wars

Update given by Alexander

The fee for the event site was given to the site on June 1st. Alexander viewed the site, looking it over with a fine tooth comb. He has pictures, and has been developing a sketch of a layout for the event set up. There are some areas that were not used last year that will be used this year. Some areas have also been upgraded.

Montvale asked Alexander when their share of the money is due. It was agreed at the meeting that they will be told that we need \$400 from them by Sept 1st.

Atlatl will be held at the event, and it will be in between archery and thrown weapons. Naomi noted that marshals will need to coordinate if the safety areas overlap. The plan is to have tournaments for the ranged weapons during the day. The Archery marshal is from Black Rose, with someone from Buckland Cross to support her. The Thrown weapons marshal is Matt from Archer's Ford. Dominic from Montvale is running atlatl.

There is small cathedral near the water for bards to make music. They will not need to make music in the hall, which had bad acoustics last year.

There is a new pavilion for outdoor A&S (depending on the weather)

Merchants will be placed outside, but next to the main hall.

Alexander asked Bhakail for help finding a heavy weapons marshal for the event. Alexander also asked their excellencies Bhakail to encourage the Royals to attend the event.

The plan is for fencing and heavy to alternate so that each will have time to use the field for a field battle, and then each will have a tournament when the other group is using the field. Alexander has a tentative schedule, but once he gets marshals, he can plan more

The Archer's Ford webmistress will be send updated info as soon as Alexander has it. She has some info already.

The goal is to get things in shape so we can start advertising the event by the end of June. Kathryn stressed the importance of pushing information out to people.

Scadians from Bright Hills Barony in Atlantia may attend. Aethelmearc has big event that weekend, so we will not get much attendance from them.

Brewing Event, Archer's Ford

Alexander presented the shires bid for their February (Saturday Feb. 27th) brewing event. This is a first reading, the bid will be submitted again in July or September with more information for a second vote. Lady Sibylla atte Blakeley is the autocrat, with Alexander as co-autocrat. There will be A&S classes, as well as brewing classes at the event. They are still looking for a site, but have an idea in mind (a bar!). The site must be cheap, and allow alcohol and have room for classes. If the shire has trouble finding a site, St. John's church is also an option. They hope that the budget will come in at \$500 max for the event. Everyone present voted in favor of the bid.

New Business

Alexander noted that he will be attending a meeting of Western region seneschals at an event the second weekend in June. They will be discussing the idea of advocating for the development of a formal Western region. This idea was discussed, and everyone at the meeting was in favor of this idea. There were no major objections. It would help the region because it would mandate that royal progress events would be held here. The Western region would just need to make sure to work together to put on these events successfully.

Sarah is trying to get an SCA club at West Chester college going. Naomi offered to do workshops there, she is an alum.

Elizabet encouraged people to attend an event on July 20th in Settmore Swamp called "A day in the Solar" It is a donation event, with a potluck. There will be some classes, and a large fabric stash for people to look through.

Naomi raised the idea of encouraging TRH's to give out awards at shires if they attend events in those areas. She noted this would help TRM's. It might also encourage royalty to attend events in shires. This is not currently happening due to the number of baronial investitures.
