Meeting people in and around Hartshorn-dale

Maire ni Sheaghdha Maire's first experience with the SCA was in 1996 in Meridies, but she moved shortly afterwards to Rusted Woodlands (northern NJ). She came to Hartshorn dale about 20 years ago, though her activity has waxed and waned through the years. She started out as a heavy weapons fighter, but eventually found fencing where she had a passion. She started the Hartshorn-dale fencing practice when she was our Rapier Marshal, a position she served for many years. She says it's possible she'll return to fencing. In the meantime, Maire has been very busy in her role as Technical Director for the Performing Arts Tent at Pennsic. She also always jumps in to help at local events, whether it's dishwashing, chair setting, or sweeping up at the end.

Maire's original persona was 14th century Irish, which she chose because her ancestry is Irish and she felt it worked with her heavy fighter interests. Her name is a Gaelicized version of her first name and her last name is her grandmother's maiden name which she traced back to the 14th century. However, when she started fencing, she wanted to move her persona to late 16th/early 17th century and base it on Grace O'Malley. Maire ni Sheaghdha, translates as Mary daughter of Shea or, simply Mary O'Shea. Her heraldry is *Per bend sinister vert and azure, a pegasus segreant argent crined and winged Or, a bordure Or semy of triskeles vert*. There are two moments that stand out for Maire in her time in the SCA. The first is when her husband, Wormwood, proposed to her at an event. He reached out to the event autocrat in advance, not realizing she was a cadet to the autocrat, things did not quite go as planned, but friends helped, the proposal happened, and they remain happily married!

The second amazing moment was the year Pennsic went dark That year, the Known World Players did their end of Pennsic performance that evening. The Performing Arts Tent is an actual theatre under a tent which includes lights which need electricity. Power was still out an hour before curtain. The whole company and several other performers came together to figure out what to do. One moment they were all brainstorming solutions, the next moment everyone disappeared, followed by everyone returning with multiple ways of illuminating the University courtyard and others were moving chairs from the tent into the courtyard. That was the Pennsic when the Known World Players performed Shakespeare Under The Stars. It was absolutely amazing and magical!"

Maire would like newcomers to know she is a professional costume designer and seamstress and am always happy to help novice sewers with their projects. Don't hesitate to reach out nor think that a question is stupid! If you are lacking in knowledge, someone will have answers! And, welcome to Hartshorn-Dale and the SCA!

Highlights of an officer's job

Knight Marshal

- A. This position is the administrative position that assists all the marshals of the various martial arts being practiced in Hartshorn-dale
- B. Expected time commitment <1 hour/week
- C. Reports due quarterly at the end of Feb, May, Aug, and Nov
- D. Ensure there is a warranted marshal present at any martial activities including but not limited to Fencing, Heavy Weapons, Archery, and Thrown Weapons.
- E. Pre-requisites: have an interest in making sure martial activities are happening.

Seeking New Officers

Speak with the seneschal if you are interested in any of these positions. Every position listed here is required as a barony, and most are not time consuming at all. Listed in order of the level of need.

Deputy Exchequer. And/or Chamberlain which is a deputy to the exchequer. We are required to have a deputy to the Exchequer, who is being trained in the Exchequer policies, and becomes a signer for the bank account. The Chamberlain is responsible for tracking the items Hartshorn-dale owns. The Deputy and the Chamberlain can be the same person. Anyone who might become our Exchequer must live in the Hartshorn-dale borders and cannot share a household with the Seneschal.

Deputy Seneschal. James is seeking someone interested in becoming seneschal once he steps down, and is willing to come on board and train for the role. There is currently a

deputy, so the requirement to have a deputy seneschal is filled, but we need to have the next generation of officers thinking about it, and learning the role. Anyone who might become our Seneschal must live in the Hartshorn-dale borders and cannot share a household with the Exchequer.
